

Max E. Roper West Disc Golf Course Improvements

The Lincoln Flying Disc Club is partnering with the Lincoln Parks Foundation to make improvements to the disc golf courses at Max E. Roper Park in northwest Lincoln. Over the past year, the disc golf course at Max E. Roper East Park has been completely updated with new tee boxes, baskets and new hole signage. This campaign is to extend the improvements to Max E. Roper West Park. The goal is to raise \$30,000 to install new concrete tee pads for a pro tee and an amateur tee on each hole, new hole signage and new baskets. Improvements are needed to respond to the increased demand and usage of the disc golf courses and to be able to host competitive events.

MAX E. ROPER PARK

Max E. Roper Park is a 144 acre park, which stretches along I-180 from 10th and Belmont Street and north to 3rd and Superior Street. It includes the disc golf courses on each side of the interstate, two tennis courts, a walking trail, off street parking,

a playground and a picnic shelter. This park is centrally located and easily accessible from I-180. When the two disc golf courses are updated, they will be able to accommodate nearly 1,000 disc golfers per day for recreational purposes and 180 disc golfers for competitive events.

HELP US IMPROVE ROPER WEST!

Our campaign goal of \$30,000 will build 54 new concrete tee pads for the 18 hole course. This will provide both amateur and pro tees for each hole and new hole baskets. New tee signs and a message board are also planned.

TIMELINE

Construction will begin as soon as 100% of the funds are committed. The construction will take approximately 3 months. Help us reach our goal and have a new course yet in 2018!
